Description:

Educators know intuitively that a positive school culture leads to higher student achievement; furthermore educational research supports this commonsense idea. So how, then, do schools build a positive school culture? At Milford Public Schools we are building and reinforcing a positive school culture through the use of an overarching theme. This comprehensive theme is expressed through this exhortation: "Everyone has a story . . . make yours worth telling." Students are supported as they write their story by our PK-12, district-developed, character education/discipline model - Eagle Pride. The Eagle Pride model gives us the vocabulary and protocols we need to make sure we are doing what is best for our kids. The success we have had flows from everyone working toward a common goal while recognizing that school culture is always a work in progress. In our judgment, the work has paid dividends for both our students and staff.
