

Definition of a Migratory Child

General Eligibility Requirements

- √ Age: younger than 22
- √ School completion: has not graduated from high school or has not obtained a GED
- √ Moved: the child moved on his or her own or with a parent who is a temporary or seasonal agriculture worker
 - •The move was from one school district to another
 - The move was due to economic necessity
 - The move was within the past 36 months
- √ Purpose of the move: to seek or obtain qualifying work
- ✓ Qualifying work: seasonal or temporary agricultural job

Qualifying work

- * The work is agricultural
- * The work is seasonal or temporary (less than 1 year)
- * Planting, cultivating, or harvesting seasonal crops
- * Custom harvesters that move across school district lines

- *Nursery work or tree planting (not-landscaping, or forestry)





Nebraska Highly Mobile Rate: 4.36%


Bayard Highly Mobile Rate: 8.73%
